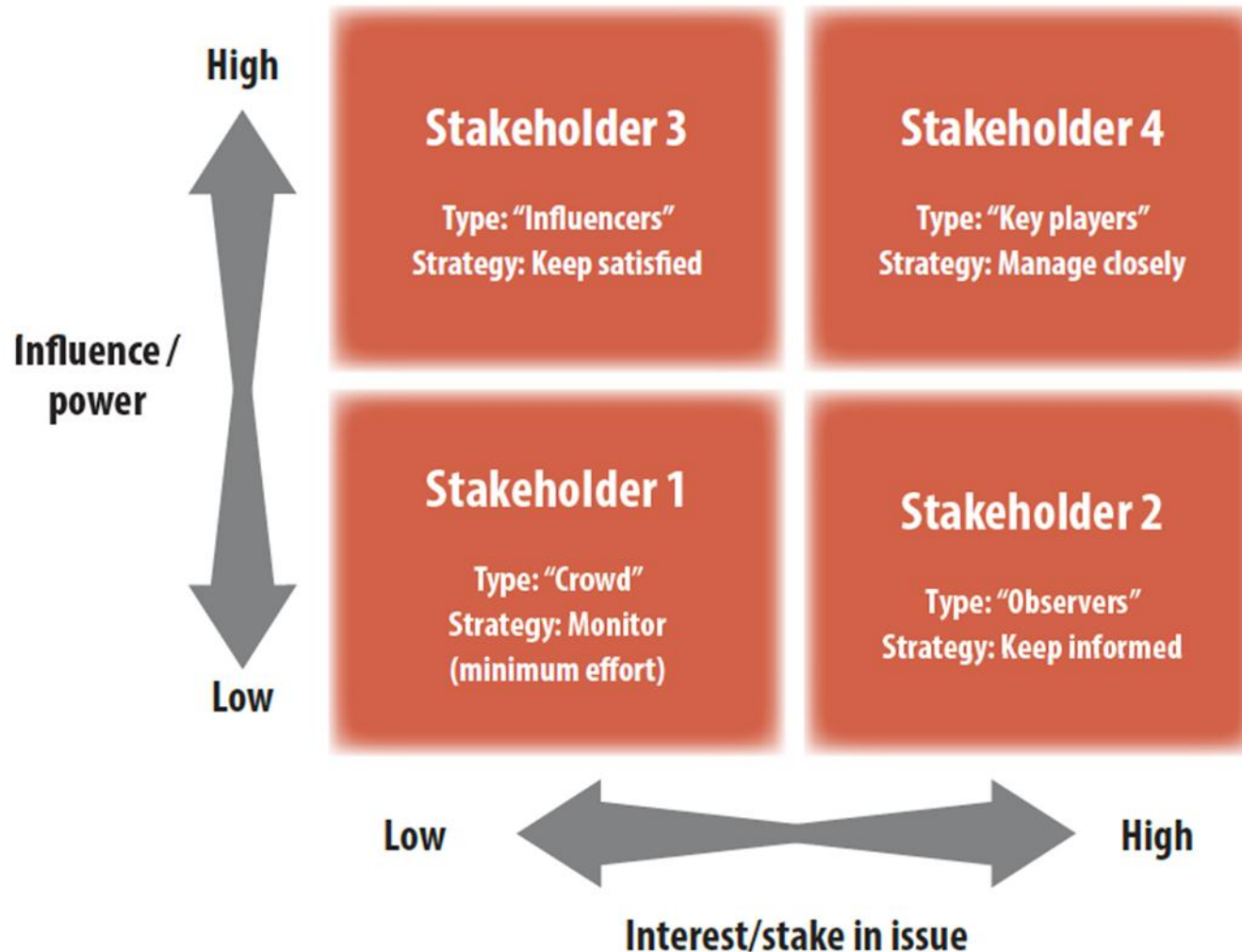
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– Non-government stakeholders – Influenced by / influential on public policy

- Politicians
- Non-government organizations (NGO)
- Civil society groups
- Religious organizations
- Research institutes
- Commissions, institutes – e.g., human rights
- Labour unions
- Professional associations
- Business associations
- Private businesses
- Development organizations, donors and banks
- Think tanks
- Media
- Certain individuals – e.g., ‘famous people’, bloggers, you-tubers
- Etc.

Setting agenda - examples

What is helpful?

- Speak-up for left-out, missing and invisible population groups
- Share data
- Provide insight into causes
- Offer solutions
- Etc.

How to engage?

- Individual consultations
- Consensus building workshops
- Ad hoc / continuous knowledge networks
- Etc.

Shaping public discourse - examples

What is helpful?

- Frame health and health inequity in upstream causes / social determinants
- Express HiAP values
- Communicate facts
- Counter misinformation
- Speak truth-to-power
- Etc.

How to engage?

- Access to facts and information
- Training
- Regular briefings
- Networks of 'influencers'
- Support select opinion / thought leaders
- Etc.

Implementing policy - examples

What is helpful?

- Adhere to policy
- Reach-out to disadvantaged, left-out, and invisible population groups
- Break new ground
- Document 'change-success'
- Etc.

How to engage?

- Legislation
- Inspection / regulation
- Contract
- Path-finder / 90-day projects
- Policy Implementation Teams
- Share best practice
- Etc.

Enhancing accountability - examples

What is helpful?

- Parliamentary debates
- Local political debates
- Popular voice and demand
- Voices of the disadvantaged, left-out and missing population groups
- Voices of the young
- Etc.

How to engage?

- Indicator and commitment documentation
- Monitoring and evaluation group(s)
- National Population Health Report
- National Health Forum
- Etc.
